The Charles Dickens rose is a hybrid tea variety with beautifully formed, eye catching bright red, swirling blooms, lightly scented and on long stems. It is complemented with striking dark red early foliage which ages to an attractive semi-glossed olive green with dark purple veins. Flowering in repeat waves from mid-June to late autumn, this stunning high-performance variety has excellent disease resistance.

Bred by highly regarded amateur breeder Ronnie Rawlins, it was selected by Marion Dickens, great-great-granddaughter of Charles Dickens, and generously sponsored by Chris Spree, trustee of the Charles Dickens Centre (Gad's Hill). The rose was launched at the Hampton Court Flower Show in July 2016 by Style Roses of Holbeach, Lincolnshire. It is ideal for mid-border planting or in tubs, pots and barrels. Height 90 cms / 3 ft.
