### ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

---

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Annual General Meeting of The Dickens Fellowship will be held at the Hotel Casa 400 in Amsterdam at 9.00 am on Saturday 29<sup>th</sup> July 2006, during the Centenary Annual Conference to transact the following business:

- (a) to receive and to consider the report of Council on the activities of the Fellowship;
- (b) to receive and to consider the annual accounts and balance sheet of the Fellowship;
- (c) to elect the Honorary Officers;
- (d) to confirm the recommendations of Council in respect of membership subscriptions and affiliation fees;
- (e) to transact such other business as Council may decide is appropriate for a General Meeting;

The **Agenda** for the meeting will be published on the Fellowship website in due course.

#### There are three resolutions proposed by Council.

1. **The following subscription rates are recommended for 2007 onwards.** The last increase in the rates was agreed at the 2003 Conference for implementation in 2004. Current rates are shown in parentheses.

 Other member at same address: £9.50 (£8.00)  
 New Member in first year of membership: £8.00 (£6.00)

*The Dickensian*: Individual non-DF member **not** in UK: £17.50 (£14.50)  
*The Dickensian*: Institutional subscriber in UK: £25.00 (£16.00)

*The Dickensian*: Institutional subscriber **not** in UK: £28.00 (£18.00)

Branch dues for affiliation to DF: £30 (no change).

2. **It is proposed** that Mrs Lee Ault and Mrs Joan Dicks will be appointed as Joint Honorary General Secretaries of The Dickens Fellowship with effect from July 2006. **It is proposed** that Mrs Dicks will become the *ex officio* Trustee on the Board of Trustees of The Charles Dickens Museum.
3. **It is proposed** that, with effect from October 2006, members of the Central Fellowship would be asked to submit nominations, with a proposer and seconder, for the six Council places representing them as stated in the Constitution Part A Section VII. Those elected would serve for three years. Those currently fulfilling this role will be eligible for re-election if they wish.

Every member of the Dickens Fellowship is entitled to vote at an Annual General Meeting, or to inform the Honorary General Secretary (or, in the case of Branch members, the Branch Secretary, who will then notify the Honorary General Secretary) in writing seven days before the meeting, of the way they wish to vote, on any specific resolution before it.

Every resolution put to an Annual General Meeting shall be decided by a show of hands together with any votes lodged with the Honorary General Secretary 7 days beforehand. The chairman of the meeting shall be the sole and absolute judge of the validity of every vote. Each member shall have one vote and the chairman of the meeting shall have an additional, casting, vote.

This notice of the Annual General Meeting has been sent by the Honorary General Secretary to the Honorary Secretary of each branch, and to individual members who are not associated with any branch, at least thirty days before the meeting, stating the agenda and giving members the

opportunity to register a proxy vote. **It is the responsibility of Branch Honorary Secretaries to inform branch members and to notify the Honorary General Secretary of any matters arising therefrom, including the identity of proxy votes.**

### EVENT AT FREEMASONS' HALL

Every summer the Library and Museum of Freemasonry hold a summer exhibition. This year the theme is the history of the Hall, with which there are some Dickensian connections including a mention in *Sketches by Boz* and a dinner held for Dickens prior to his departure for the USA. The evening event is called "A Celebration of Freemasons' Hall". The history of the Freemasons' Hall site from the eighteenth century to the 1930s is marked by an evening reception with wine, cocktails and music from Mozart to the Jazz Age. There will be an opportunity for a private view of the

David Warland and Elsie Sadler both submitted an article from The Worthing Herald and Gazette of 13 April on the lodging house at Number 10 Bath Place, Worthing where Dickens installed his mistress Ellen Ternan, from December 1868 to June 1869. The article noted that, in a local directory of 1870, it is listed as a lodging house owned by Thomas Moore: could this have been a 'cover' used by Dickens to keep his ownership secret?
